DR. KARLA J. SMITHGovernor



SERI JUBLI'S 3H'S OF HOLISTIC EDUCATION

At Seri Jubli, our vision is empowering lives through holistic education. To empower is to inspire and provide the educational experience using the three H's: the Head, the Hands and the Heart.

The **Head** refers to the academic aspect of teaching and learning. These include cognitive development, academic achievement and excellence, the curriculum, IGCSE, certification and further education for the students.

Then we look at the **Hands**, which refers to the skills and psychomotor development of a child. To do this, the core subjects are physical education, cooking, art, ICT (which includes programming, javascript, web-development), co-curricular activities like drama, dance, entrepreneur club and so on. The aim is to develop skills that can be translated into daily learning and living.

However, in order for the head and the hands to be effective, we focus on the **Heart** as well, which is the emotional development of a child. This covers areas such as character development, emotional intelligence, leadership skills, motivation and aspiration as all these stem from the heart. We do

this through different methods such as moral studies and a program called Personal and Social Development. We have community service and the house system program, where students learn to interact with different people from different races, ages and backgrounds.

Our goal is to send out well-rounded global youngsters who are confident, committed and able to bring about change in our world.

In 2004, Shalom was founded by the late Rev. Selvasunther as a homeschool centre, being the first learning centre in Kluang to provide English-medium education. At the end of 2013, a decision was made to move the centre towards Private/International Schooling. In 2014, Seri Jubli Academy (SJA) was established under the leadership of Executive Director, Mr. Lee Kok Hwee. Together with a team of dedicated staff and teachers, SJA started the building of their very own international school campus in 2018. After completion in 2019, they obtained their operating license. In 2020, the dream of Seri Jubli International School was realised as they welcomed their first batch of students.



IGCSE

Seri Jubli International school adopts the international curriculum from Cambridge, which is accepted and recognised by tertiary education institutions and employers worldwide. Students will take their International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) Examinations, developed by Cambridge International Assessment Education (CIAE), at Year 11. Following this, they may opt to do foundation, international matriculation, A-levels or Pre-University programmes according to the degree they wish to pursue.



What is an International Curriculum?

- Over 10,000 schools in over 160 countries follow the Cambridge international curriculum.
- The curriculum is international in philosophy and approach, but can be tailored to local contexts.



CO-CURRICULUM Personal and Social Development

Addressing the Personal and Social Development (PSD) needs, Seri Jubli International School has partnered with LEADERONOMICS and CHARACTER FIRST EDUCATION with weekly theoretical lessons and applications. These are awardwinning and internationally recognised providers of character formation and leadership skills development and application.

Throughout the year, students are given opportunities to apply these lessons in various leadership roles such as: house leaders, prefects, sports representatives, duty managers, club presidents, librarians, class monitors etc.

Primary school students (Key stage 1 & Key stage 2) undergo CHARACTER FIRST EDUCATION, whilst Secondary school students (Key stage 3 & Key stage 4) undergo LEADERONOMICS training.

CCA (Co-curricular) Clubs

Students have the opportunity to learn about and sign up for the many activities available every academic year: badminton, basketball, cooking, art & craft, dance, design, drama, STEM, entrepreneurship, etc.

These clubs are focused on exposing students to soft skills, helping them explore different learning styles and skills, expanding their horizons and options for who they aspire to be. At the same time, SJIS hopes to groom students towards being competitive at a larger scale in these various skills as well.

*Availability of clubs changes based on students' interests & needs and teachers' specialities

ECA (Extra-Curricular) Clubs

SJIS also provides optional extracurricular classes for various subjects, skills & interests. If students are interested, these after school activities will further widen or reinforce their existing skills or interests.

HOUSE SYSTEM

As is the practice of many British schools, SJIS adopts a House system. The House system has proven to have many benefits, including:

- Pastoral care of students
- Peer care (Mentoring & buddy system)
- Ease of organisation of students to facilitate leadership
- Efficient groupings for competitions, activities









(e.g. sports day, club time, in-school celebrations)

- Providing an avenue for positive reinforcement (e.g. through house points)
- Providing an avenue for friendly competition (e.g. through house points)

The four houses - Aeris, Aqua, Ignis and Terra – are named after the four classical elements in Latin, which refer to the elements of air, water, fire and earth, which were thought to explain the nature and complexity of ALL matter and life.

The house system at SJIS also forms the basis of most of school life. Each student is placed in one of the four houses, and remains in it until graduation. Each house performs duties, takes part in competitions, celebrates accomplishments, and takes care of its members throughout the school year. These enable students to form a sense of family and belonging with their housemates.

COMMUNITY SERVICE & ENGAGEMENTS

Here at SJIS, we believe in the social and corporate responsibility of every community member to contribute back to society, and to leave a lasting positive impact on the world. This creates holistic global citizens, with greater academic and social achievements. Students are encouraged to use the skills and knowledge learned through classes, clubs or character formation & leadership projects to give back to the community. When schools have strong relationships with families and community organisations, they create an environment that has a greater impact on students.

SJIS has various community service and humanitarian aid partners, including NGO-s like Eden Community Services Centre & ROCK House Community Services.

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

Part of nurturing global citizens includes exposing students to the beauty, variety and diversity of the world. SJIS makes every effort to provide opportunities for our students to engage with others on an international level. As part of this effort, SJIS has a standing Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Handong Global University (HGU) in South Korea, offering various opportunities for collaboration through exchange programs, and Annual Summer Leadership Camps.

SJIS also takes every opportunity to expose students through visiting international students, cultural exchanges and providing options for tertiary studies at international institutions.



Strategic location

Located in the centre of the state of Johor, Seri Jubli is the first and only international school in Kluang. Kluang is an easily accessible town as it is served by the national railway (train), the North–South Expressway and local trunk roads linking it to all neighbouring districts (car/bus). In addition, Senai International Airport is only about an hour away.

Ideal environment

Being a fairly laid-back town, Kluang takes pride in its cleaner air and lack of traffic jams. As the cost of living here is significantly lower than big cities such as Kuala Lumpur and Johor Bahru, it is definitely a place of choice for raising a family with ample shopping destinations and good medical services.

English-medium education

Seri Jubli adopts an English-medium education curriculum from Year 1 all the way to Year 11 where the students take the internationally recognised IGCSE examinations. In addition, students also learn the Malay and Chinese language in school.

Small class size

It has been proven that students learn faster and perform better in smaller classes, which results in more individual attention, increased participation, and better communication between the teacher and students. This is why the classes in Seri Jubli are limited to 25 students.


































OUR FACILITIES
